



Grants

Artists in Education — Grants for Districts

Open to all BC School Districts, the Federation of Independent School Associations and the First Nations Schools Association, this funding program is designed to support a wide range of arts activities impacting students all across the province. This grant is funded by BC Arts Council and the Province of BC.

Artists in the Classroom — Grants for Schools

Teachers, principals and PAC representatives can apply for Artists in the Classroom grants to bring professional artists into their classrooms. These grants support projects in schools across BC that demonstrate artistic excellence, strong curricular connections, high levels of student engagement and an active partnership between an educator and a professional artist. This grant is funded by BC Arts Council and the Province of BC. artstarts.com/aic

Cherniavsky's "Mr. Music" Fund

This fund offers matching grants of up to \$500 to assist schools in purchasing tickets for students to attend a wide range of classical music, opera or ballet. Sponsored by the Cherniavsky Junior Club for the Performing Arts Society, the funding program was named after an endowment created by Jan Cherniavsky, a world-renowned classical pianist.

Artists in the Classroom

ArtStarts supports rich learning experiences in the classroom through artist residencies in which students work directly with professional artists on hands-on, curriculum integrated projects that deepen learning and foster critical thinking.



Case Study: Understanding the Tidal Pool Through Metaphor

On Haida Gwaii, students from Sk'aadgaa Naay Elementary dove into an investigation of local ocean life in a project that encompassed learning in science, the environment, social studies,

language arts, music and clay sculpture.

Guided by a Parks Canada representative, students in Kindergarten to Grade 6 visited the shoreline to explore the intertidal zone—the area that is above water at low tide and under water at high tide. Students learned about this habitat and the many creatures who call this place home, including starfish, sea urchins, crabs and octopus. Students quickly learned to name and respect each tidal animal.

Back in the classroom, everyone chose one

creature to focus on, and responded to questions such as "How has this creature adapted for survival?" "How does it relate to other creatures?" and "How do you connect to this creature?"

Exploring the concept of metaphor, students crafted creative writing responses in English, French and Haida. Some classes created books to read together. Others composed songs about their experience with their Haida immersion teacher and local musician Wendy Watts.

They also visited the local museum to see how tidal pools had inspired local artist Darrell Oike. Darrell taught the students how to work with clay, and each student created their own clay ocean creature, translating their experiences at the beach and in the classroom into something tangible. Finally, the clay tiles came together to build a tidal pool mural for the whole school to learn from and enjoy.

"This project found its place in our hearts," said Special Education Assistant Eric Boucher, "and made it home through oceanic flows of artistic cooperation, playful hearts and minds, and dedication in our shared passions for the ocean's life streams."

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



ARTSTARTS IN SCHOOLS

Artists on Tour Directory

This directory features approximately 100 performances and workshops created specifically for young audiences. Presentations range from theatre and storytelling to dance, music and interdisciplinary arts. They are listed in alphabetical order by artist name and include fees and booking information. All Artists on Tour are professional artists or youth groups with experience performing for and/or working with young people.

ArtStarts Booking Service

Are you interested in bringing a touring performance or workshop into your school? Make it easy on yourself and engage the ArtStarts booking service. We provide a convenient, cost-effective service to help bring some of the best performing artists to your students. Our Booking and Touring Manager is here to assist you and can advise you on artist availability, programming, touring, schedules and fees.

Here's how it works...

1 • Select a Presentation

Browse this directory of approximately 100 artistic presentations representing a diverse cross-section of performing arts disciplines and cultures.

2 • Contact ArtStarts

Once you've made your selection, contact our Booking and Touring Manager or fax us a **Performance Booking Request Form** (available in this Directory or online at artstarts.com/booking-touring). We'll contact the artists you have selected, schedule their touring dates and times, and confirm their availability with you.

3 • Confirm the Events

ArtStarts will contact you by fax or email with a list of the artists and their fees, as well as the dates and times they are scheduled to come to your school. We work with you to choose an available date that works with your schedule.

4 • Letter of Agreement

Within a few weeks of confirming the date and time with you, we will send you a Letter of Agreement listing all fees and taxes, to be signed and returned to us.

5 • Invoices

You can expect to receive your invoice the month prior to your event. The ArtStarts \$35 booking fee is included in all listed Artist Fees.

6 • Monthly Reminders

Each month, ArtStarts sends out email reminders to all schools and districts with scheduled events for the following month.

Selecting and Booking Artists

For a District

School districts select artists in a variety of ways. Using the Artists on Tour Directory as a guide, some select a handful of artists and book them into all of their schools, while others shortlist and send a recommended list to every principal in the district.

For an Individual School

Some districts leave all selection, confirmation and contracting to individual schools. If you are in charge of your school's bookings, simply use the Artists on Tour Directory to make your selections, then contact ArtStarts, and we'll take care of the details.

Ensuring the Visit Runs Smoothly

ArtStarts provides every artist or group with detailed itineraries of dates, times, venues, addresses, phone numbers and contact names for each school on their tour. Artists are advised to send their study guides and/or Know-Wonder-Learn charts to the school at least two weeks before their performance, and to contact each school at least one week before their visit to re-confirm dates, arrival times and technical needs.

To make the most of your artist visit, teachers are encouraged to use the resource materials provided by the artist before their visit. This will help familiarize your students with the artist's work and what to expect during their visit. Study guides and Know-Wonder-Learn charts are available online at artstarts.com/study-guides

Also, advise any staff involved with the artist's technical needs to prepare for the artist's arrival. Finally, let the artist or group know about school-related details such as parking availability, sign-in procedures, lunch facilities and staff-room location.
