2021 was an opportunity for ArtStarts to deepen and expand its learning and practices while navigating an ever-changing pandemic reality. New and existing team members came together to discover how we could continue to serve young people, artists, schools, and communities through virtual and physical space in ways which were considered, engaging, and meaningful.

This past year laid significant ground work for implementing and operationalizing exciting new practices at ArtStarts. We had the opportunity to plan for an organizational restructure, which sees the organization move away from a single Executive Director to a shared leadership model of three Co-Directors; we spent hours consulting and engaging with networks in our community to uncover how we can better implement our vision for arts integration in education for social justice, which inspired new programming; and we continued to refine our technical systems to better serve the artists and educators who use our services. Systems Change and Anti-Oppression

In alignment with our Strategic Plan, In 2021 ArtStarts had an opportunity to start delving more deeply into systems change work made possible by funding from the Vancouver Foundation. Throughout the year, we had the opportunity to hold community engagement sessions to interrogate the question of which barriers are stopping us from more effectively integrating arts in education for social justice.

This series of sessions hosted several different subsections of our community including teaching artists, educators, school administrators, district workers, education sector advocates, and most importantly - youth. Each session brought together community members in a way which offered us a chance to learn from rich, facilitated, honest conversations.

This work continues into 2022 as we look inward as an organization to learn about our own positionality in relation to systems change work, and apply the learnings of our 2021 sessions to develop and inform our programming and practices.
