About ArtStarts

ArtStarts in Schools is a charitable organization that expands the role of art in education to activate learning and nurture creativity in British Columbia's young people.

We focus on creating meaningful change where young people benefit most equitably and directly—in their schools and classrooms.

By providing young people with access to arts-based learning experiences, we develop a generation that values the creative, collaborative and innovative skills necessary to thrive in learning and in life.

MISSION (what we do)

ArtStarts in Schools provides innovative arts programs for young people, practical resources for teachers and artists, and leadership in advocacy for arts in education.

VISION (why we do it)

ArtStarts envisions a society where the arts are regarded as an essential part of educating young people and a catalyst for creating innovative, engaged, and contributing members of society.

ArtStarts respectfully acknowledges that we carry out our work on the lands of Indigenous nations throughout colonial British Columbia.

Systems Change and Anti-Oppression

ArtStarts continues to explore the possibilities for transformation and change, following the learning journey that began in 2018, which allowed us to deepen our understanding of how we relate to power, privilege, systems of oppression, and justice. We know we cannot advocate for the arts as an essential component of education without understanding how systems privilege some students, teachers, and artists over others.

Throughout 2019 and 2020, ArtStarts engaged artists from equity seeking groups, and we will continue to actively bring their workshops, performances, and diverse stories to share with students and teachers across BC.

2020 has been a fast-changing and transformative time, yet our commitment to systems change is ongoing and ever-evolving, anchored in our internal and external anti-oppression work, as well as in our new strategic plan for the next four years.

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Our Team


Staff

Digital Learning Lab

Learning Lab is a free professional development opportunity for artists to build their capacity to plan, fund, and lead arts-integrated experiences in schools and classrooms.

ArtStarts hosted two Learning Lab series in 2020, pivoting to a digital format in order to adjust to COVID-19. For accessibility purposes, workshops were available with live automated captioning through Google Meet, and sessions were kept between 60 to 90 minutes to account for issues like screen and video call fatigue.



COVID Conscious Artist Directory

The **Artists on Tour Directory** integrates over 90 professional performing artists into schools across 61 districts to book artists throughout the school year.

Due to social gathering restrictions and the overall health and safety guidelines resulting from the pandemic, ArtStarts had to make adjustments to our current Artists on Tour Directory and launch the **COVID Conscious Directory, which offered online programming and tailored in-school performances and workshops that adhered to the provincial health guidelines.** The purpose of this directory was to make arts experiences still available for students in the province, especially during such a challenging and uncertain time.

connects teachers with professional artists experienced in working in schools for the purpose of collaborating on projects that activate young learners' engagement and creativity in the classroom.

ArtStarts on Saturdays went on hiatus from March-June after closing our Gallery and Maker Space due to **COVID,** and then transitioned to online performances in July starting with Drag Story Hour with Shay and Skim! We have been joined by incredible performances from all over the province and have been so impressed and inspired by how the artists have pivoted to engaging and personable

In April, we launched **ArtStarts Explores: Our Province at Play,** a digital series of free online family programming focused on getting all age ranges and skill levels to make time for play and exploration together. We have greatly expanded our audience for weekend family programming by transitioning to online workshops, where the content can be accessed online at any time.

We had some of our first youth performers for ArtStarts on Saturdays with the Flaming **Balloon Collective in November!**

Grants

ArtStarts offers grants that support the arts in education and creative experiences for young people in British Columbia.

While COVID heavily impacted activities funded through ArtStarts grants, art is still happening all over the province!

Young people are especially craving art and connection right now. Many of the grant applications and final reports we receive highlight the importance of young people being able to express how they feel, their experiences over the last year, and their hope and fears for the future.

Financial Summary

ArtStarts in Schools experienced a 32% reduction in revenues in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy helped us retain staff and deliver free digital programming, and we ended the year with a surplus that has been reserved for future capital projects.

ArtStarts is grateful for emergency response funding that has sustained the organization through a financially challenging year.
