Apply for Grants to Support the Arts

Artists in Education Grants for Districts

Open to all BC School Districts, the Federation of Independent School Associations and the First Nations Schools Association, this funding program is designed to support a wide range of arts activities impacting students all across the province. AIE grants are funded by BC Arts Council and the Government of British Columbia's Creative Futures program.

Artists in the Classroom Grants for Schools

Teachers, principals, PAC representatives and artists can apply for Artists in the Classroom grants to bring professional artists into the classroom. These grants support projects in schools across BC that demonstrate artistic excellence, strong curricular connections, high levels of student engagement and an active partnership between an educator and a professional artist. AIC grants are funded by BC Arts Council and the Government of British Columbia's Creative Futures program.

Cherniavsky's "Mr. Music" Fund

This fund assists schools in purchasing tickets for students to attend classical and traditional music, opera or ballet. Grants cover 60% of the ticket cost, up to \$500. Supported by the Cherniavsky Junior Club for the Performing Arts Society, the funding program was named after Jan Cherniavsky, a world-renowned classical pianist.

Arts in Education Council of BC Fund

This fund offers grants of up to \$500 for educators or schools to support professional development for K-12 educators in BC. These grants can be used to assist in the presentation or attendance of professional development workshops, clinics or seminars designed to increase the appreciation of the arts for teachers in BC schools.

Artists across all disciplines living in the Columbia Basin region can apply with artsbased projects that engage young people in schools and communities. Grants up to \$1,000 are available. This grant is intended to provide a stepping stone for artists to access Artists in the Classroom Grants.

Our 4,000 square foot gallery and resource centre, located at 808 Richards Street in downtown Vancouver, is free and open to the public. The ArtStarts Showcase is Western Canada's most important showcase for schools and communities interested in arts programming for young people. Conceived over 20 years ago by a group of educators (the BC Administrators of Arts Education), the event has evolved in response to trends and needs in young people's arts programming.

From dancers and storytellers to musicians and interdisciplinary artists, the range of artists presented over the years has proven to be diverse, entertaining and educational.

Showcasing Artists

The Selection Process

Selecting performing artists for the ArtStarts Showcase is never easy. This year, we received approximately 60 applications—well exceeding the number of available spots. It is important to remember that just because an artist was not selected, it does not necessarily reflect on the artist's work. Selections are based on specific criteria as well as factors such as programming balance, location, grade-level, diversity and showcasing history.

We engage a jury made up of peer artists and educators who review the materials submitted by artists. The following criteria form the basis of their assessment.

Who	Art Practice Technical ability and professional art practice.
What	Concept + Relevance The translation of the art form to the audience experience.
How	Execution + Engagement The artist's capacity to build a relationship with the audience.

Artists on Tour Directory 2018

The Artists on Tour Directory features over 140 performances and workshops created specifically for young audiences. Presentations include theatre, storytelling, dance, music and interdisciplinary arts. They are listed in alphabetical order by artist name and include fees and booking information. All Artists on Tour are professional artists or youth groups with experience performing for and/or working with young people.

ArtStarts Booking Service

Are you interested in bringing a touring performance or workshop into your school? Make it easy on yourself and engage the ArtStarts booking service. We provide a convenient, cost-effective service to help bring some of the best performing artists to your students.

Our Booking and Touring team is here to assist you and can advise you on artist availability, programming, touring, schedules and fees.

Here's how it works...

1 • Select a Presentation

Browse this directory of almost 150 artistic presentations representing a diverse cross-section of performing arts disciplines and cultures.

2 • Submit an Online Booking Request

Once you've made your performance selections, please complete the online Booking Request Form available at **artstarts.com/booking-request-form**. We'll work with the artists you have selected to confirm their touring dates and available times.

3 • Booking Confirmation

ArtStarts will contact you by email with a list of performance dates and times scheduled for your school. We will work with you to confirm a date that works with your school schedule.

4 • Letter of Agreement

Within a few weeks of confirming the date and time with you, we will send you a Letter of Agreement, to be signed and returned to us.

5 • Invoices

You can expect to receive your invoice the month prior to your event. The ArtStarts \$35 booking fee is included in all listed Artist Fees. Many school districts make use of our District Billing service.

6 • Monthly Reminders

Each month, ArtStarts sends out email reminders to all schools and districts with scheduled events for the following month.

Selecting and Booking Artists

For Districts

School districts select artists in a variety of ways. Using the Artists on Tour Directory as a guide, some select a handful of artists and book them into all of their schools, while others shortlist and send a recommended list to every principal in the district.

For Individual Schools

Some districts leave all selection, confirmation and contracting to individual schools. If you are responsible for your school's bookings, simply use the Artists on Tour Directory to make your selections, then contact ArtStarts, and we'll take care of the details.

Ensuring the Visit Runs Smoothly

ArtStarts:

 ArtStarts provides every artist group with detailed itineraries of dates, times, venues, addresses, phone numbers and contact names for each school on their tour.

Artists:

 Artists are advised to send their study guides and/or Know-Wonder-Learn charts to the school at least two weeks before their performance, and to contact each school at least one week before their visit to re-confirm dates, arrival times and technical needs.

Schools:

- To make the most of your artist visit, and enhance cross-curricular connections, teachers are encouraged to use the resource materials provided by the artist before their visit. This will help familiarize your students with the artist's work and what to expect during their visit. Study guides and Know-Wonder-Learn charts are available online at artstarts.com/guides
- Please advise any staff involved with the artist's technical needs to prepare for the performance.
- Be sure to let the artist know about schoolrelated details such as parking availability, sign-in procedures, lunch facilities and staffroom location.

Storytelling is an oral tradition that Indigenous speaker Dallas Yellowfly blends with modern multimedia tools to create intrigue on a controversial subject. Using his experience in stand-up comedy, filmmaking, and songwriting, Yellowfly creates an engaging multimedia experience for audiences of all ages. This presentation is designed for non-Aboriginal audiences. The intention of the presenter is to promote oral traditions to all students as well as an understanding of how many Indigenous youth can develop a strong cultural identity in the wake of residential schools.

How Raven Stole the Sun

The purpose of this presentation is to teach all students about the values, traditions and culture of Indigenous peoples of the Northwest coast. Youth of all ages and cultures are encouraged to understand more by using a bit of positive humour, high energy performance and a high level of audience participation keeping it engaging and educational. The presentation focuses on holistic values and storytelling which are both significant elements of First Nations culture.

Indigenous storyteller Dallas Yellowfly brings Qwalena: The Wild Woman Who Steals Children to life in this unique theatrical multimedia storytelling presentation. The purpose of this presentation is to create awareness on the inter-generational impact of Indian residential schools. Qwalena is the allegorical creature that represents the Indian agents who stole Aboriginal children from their families and forced them into government funded Indian residential schools. Yellowfly's own father was one of these children.

They fuse Brazilian music, dance and capoeira (an astonishing display of martial arts and acrobatics) into a dynamic, high-energy performance. Aché Brasil has played to enthusiastic audiences and critical acclaim all over North America and Europe, performing in festivals, theatres, the 2010 Olympic games, and over 10,000 school shows. Experienced and professional, Aché Brasil is committed to presenting high quality performances which best exemplify Brazil's rich cultural heritage and artistic excellence.

An Explosion of Colour! Energy! And Music!

Aché Brasil fuses Brazilian music, dance and capoeira (Afro-Brazilian martial arts and acrobatics) into a dynamic, colourful, high-energy performance. The students will learn a great deal about the culture, dances, tradition and history of Brazil in an interactive fun atmosphere. They will also learn some Portuguese words and how a berimbau is made (one of the oldest instruments in the world). The performance is done with authentic costumes, dances and live music of drums, Brazilian percussion and vocals. The children will have a chance to participate (dance or play percussion instruments), enhancing their self-esteem.

Capoeira Workshops

Aché Brasil has extensive experience in teaching capoeira to young people. A typical class will begin with a light warm up followed by fundamental movements such as "ginga", cartwheels, leg rotations and balance movements. The students also learn Portuguese songs to accompany the game of capoeira. While capoeira can be an intensive activity, the classes are tailored to accommodate the physical abilities of the students. Besides gaining discipline, the students will also receive a solid workout. After ten or more workshops, students will have the opportunity to demonstrate what they learned with a performance guided by our instructors on the last day of their classes.







I'll perform another story, and then I'll drum a song. Given time, I will share portions of the history of my Haida Nation.
