2023 was an incredible year for ArtStarts, marked by diverse and empowering arts-based experiences across the province. Now in its 27th year, ArtStarts has brought young people, artists, educators, and community members together through arts and culture programming that continues to enrich students' lives and enhance self-expression.

Through our partnership with the British Columbia Arts Council, we have provided innovative grant programs to empower school districts, schools, and artists to bring arts into classrooms. We would also like to thank them for their resilience funding supplement, which was instrumental in stabilizing ArtStarts operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We are happy to report bookings for arts programming and workshops have increased, and we expect that increase to continue into 2024.

In partnership with the City Of Vancouver, ArtStarts is working to transform our 808 Richards location into an accessible arts space for young people. We also want to recognize the Canada Council for funding the digital ArtStarts gallery. The gallery is closed and expected to break ground on an exciting new upgrade in 2024.

We thank our Board of Directors for a year of outstanding contributions and commitment to solid governance that has been instrumental to ArtStarts. We want to recognize Albert Zhang and Angelique Muhorakeye for their service and exceptional commitment to ArtStarts, who have now moved on to new adventures. In 2023, we also welcomed Marielle Kho, Paisley Smith, and Malik Ali to the ArtStarts board.

We also want to extend our deep gratitude to ArtStarts staff for their dedication to ArtStarts. ArtStarts staff are critical to establishing professional, compassionate, and rewarding relationships between young people and arts and culture. Looking back on 2023, our staff brought together an incredibly successful ArtStarts Showcase, with educators and artists from throughout and beyond the province coming to bring the arts to young people. 

ARTSTARTS PROGRAMMING

ArtStarts in Schools is a charitable organization that expands the role of art in education to activate learning and nurture creativity in British Columbia's young people.

We focus on creating meaningful change where young people benefit most equitably and directly—in their schools and classrooms. By providing young people with access to arts-based learning experiences, we develop a generation that values the creative, collaborative, and innovative skills necessary to thrive in learning and in life.

ArtStarts' key areas of activity include booking school performances, grants to schools, artists, and districts, an annual conference that connects artists and educators, gallery exhibitions of young people's art, and free family programming in the community. In partnership with the BC Arts Council (BCAC), we provide funding to support art-based education in schools and grants to support artists in running arts projects involving young people.



STRATEGIC PLAN

ArtStarts' 2020-2024 Strategic Plan guided our work in creating meaningful change where young people benefit most equitably and directly—in their schools and classrooms. This five-year strategic plan is our plan of action to achieve a deeper mission impact.



Throughout 2023, we focused on providing young people with access to artsbased learning experiences. 

PARTNERSHIPS: 4P FRAMEWORK

In 2022, we began implementing the Purpose, Place, Process, & Partnership (4P) Framework, co-developed by youth and Royal Roads University's Resilience By Design Lab. This process-based framework has helped us center young people and their creativity as we work to expand the role of arts in education, integrate an anti-oppression framework, and enhance our organizational capacity.

The 4P framework informed our approach in redefining our partnership structure this year. ArtStarts had the opportunity to connect and collaborate with various local organizations that engage young people; Festival of Recorded Movement (F-O-R-M), Black Arts Vancouver, H.R. MacMillan Space Center, and Eco Nova. We are excited to have solidified these ongoing partnerships that will grow and evolve in the coming years. Given this year's success in partnerships, we are looking to also examine our grants system to reflect the 4P framework.









GALLERY AT 808 RICHARDS

In 2023, The ArtStarts Gallery at 808 Richards was closed due to ongoing renovations—we are installing new accessibility features that will significantly improve the experience for all visitors. We are excited to introduce an accessible washroom and elevator to the 2nd floor so that all young people can fully engage with ArtStarts.


While the gallery's regular operations are on pause, families walking by 808 Richards can explore and experience our Window Exhibition which features art projects made by young people!


ENGAGING FAMILIES

ArtStarts supports artists by helping establish connections between art and education, building artists' capacity to work in schools, offering grants that support creative projects and more. 

ARTISTS IN THE CLASSROOM (AIC) GRANT

Artists in the Classroom Grants bring professional artists into schools for handson learning experiences. Grants are offered up to \$3500 for small/mediumscale projects and up to \$10 000 for large-scale projects.

Through AIC, artists and educators collaborate to expand the role of arts in education and activate learning for young people across. ArtStarts received 151 AIC Applications in 2023. We assessed and funded 96 projects and disbursed all AIC funds. In a trend that continues from the 2022-23 Year, nearly half of all AIC applications were from first-time applicants.

ARTISTS IN EDUCATION (AIE) GRANT

Artists in Education (AIE) grants support artistic programming in BC school districts, including performances, workshops, and residencies.

Through AIE, artists and educators collaborate to bring thousands of performances into schools. In 2023, school-based performances strongly returned to pre-pandemic levels. BC school districts were able to bring artists for tours and cultural performances to young people throughout the province.

CREATIVE SPARK VANCOUVER (CSV) GRANT

We know that small projects can make a big impact. Launched in 2016, Creative Spark Vancouver grants support Vancouver-based emerging artists to work with young people (5-18) on an arts or culture-based project. This entrylevel grant offers up to \$5000.

TREASURER'S REPORT

We wish to thank Grant Thornton for being our 2023 auditor and sincerely appreciate the dedicated audit team led by Donna Diskos. We are grateful for their insight and experience, which help strengthen ArtStart's organizational capacity.

We also want to thank the generous donors who have supported ArtStarts' mission. With our community's support, we have contributed to incredible arts and culture performances and activities for young people across the province.

2023 marked another powerful and decisive moment for ArtStarts' organization's finances. We began our financial year with a projected operating deficit. In Q1 of 2023, ArtStarts received a recovery allocation from the BC Arts Council of \$252,063, significantly offsetting the 2022 deficiency.

Throughout the remaining quarters of 2023, ArtStarts began restructuring towards sustainable organization. I'd like to thank Heather Campbell and Jules André-Brown for their diligence and leadership in helping ArtStarts strengthen its financial health, steward the organization's resources and refocus our strategy.

2024 and beyond is an exciting chapter in our organization's history. ArtStarts is well-positioned to a new future in helping young people experience diverse and empowering arts and culture in education throughout BC.
